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PHOTO SCAVENGER HUNT PUZZLE HUNTS

Solve the puzzle by collecting and solving the individual clues. For example, our local churches hold one where you go from church to church and when you solve one, the representative gives you the clue to the next church. It is a city-wide puzzle hunt.

For puzzle hunts, you need to decide if you will have people who provide the clues / answers or if you want to provide printed clues hidden for your hunters. For printed clues, this could be printed from your computer and placed in something or written in chalk at a location. Suggest to your hunters to take photos of the clues so they don't forget from one location to the next.

Audio Clues

Create MP3s of clues or sounds to help them locate the next clue. You can have one person with a recorder playing it or make it downloadable via a smart phone. Always test URLs available for listening. For storylines, you might even want to create videos and post them to YouTube for viewing.

Inserted Clues

Carry a theme for your hunt by using themed items to hold your computer-printed clues. Some items to hide clues in include:

- Plastic Easter eggs
- Small bottles / jars
- Small pouches
- Small baskets
- Envelopes
- · Zip top bags

Laminated Clues

Another way to place clues is to laminate printed sheets. This provides protection against the weather and allows you to use your clues again.
