Flag Charm 02: Maryland

This SWAP creates a flag charm that can be used on a decorated safety pin so that it hangs freely.

TOOLS:

- Scissors or paper cutter
- 1/8" hole paper punch
- Jewelry pliers
- Laminator (or clear contact paper)

MATERIALS:

- Flag, attached
- O-ring
- Glue
- Safety pin

STEPS:

Assemble.

Print the insert. Cut it down as indicated. Fold in half.

Laminate.

Laminate so it extends on all edges with extra on the top edge.

Attach.

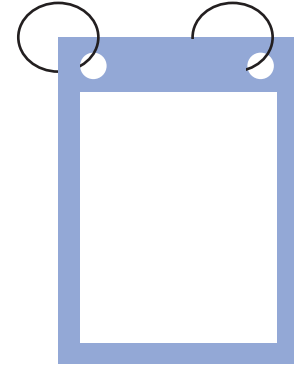
Punch a hole in the upper left corner. Punch should be through laminate only to minimize chance of moisture destroying the paper. Attach an O-ring.

Pin.

Decorate your pin as desired or leave it empty. Attach the flag to the pin with the O-rings.

NOTE: Depending on your ability there are two ways to do this. Put the first O-ring on the flag. Put the ring on the pin, add beads, then put the second O-ring. You can also put on the beads, then add the O-rings for both corners at the same time. Use what works best for you.

ALTERNATIVE: You can create a paper bead slightly smaller than the area between the O-rings and roll it onto the pin, then add the flag.
