## MATERIALS:

## STEPS:

Define two different areas with space between. Explain that one side is “yes” and one is “no” if you’re using these types of questions. If you’re asking choice questions, be sure to be clear which side represents each answer.

Ask questions that allow two different answers, such as yes / no questions. State the question and define which area is for which choice.

Everyone moves to the side that is the most correct for them.

You'll want to ask a minimum of six questions. You can tell if your audience is getting bored if you watch their body language and listen to comments.
